Barbara Dennistoun, Convener South Lanarkshire

Barbara was registered as a childminder in March 2002, and in 2018 she also became a partner provider with South Lanarkshire Council to deliver funded Early Learning and Childcare (ELC) to children and families in her community.

For 10 years, Barbara had been a foster carer alongside her childminding career, where she has gained further experience of working with children and their families, with a focus on understanding their needs and sensitivities.

Holding an SVQ Level 3 in Children's Learning, Care and Development, Barbara also takes part in on-going job-relevant training with SCMA and her local authority.

She has previously served on the Scottish Executive Board, and then during the COVID-19 pandemic she felt quite isolated and returned to the Board in 2021. Katy Pollock Argyll and Bute


